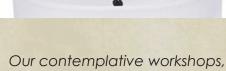


The Life & Writings of Maya Angelou

The Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius of Loyola: A Pattern for Prayer & Transformation

Born in 1491 in the Basque region of northern Spain, Ignatius, a soldier in the Spanish army, became the founder of the Jesuits. This class will introduce you to his conversion and transformation which form the basic pattern of a method of prayer that has helped individuals over the centuries to seek and find the presence and will of God in their lives.
