Kalia Mussetter has been a visual artist all her life, working in many media. Fourteen years ago, an elder woman in one of Kalia's tribes taught her to quilt, and she was soon after taken under the wing of master quilter, Betty Anne Guadalupe, and apprenticed in the old way for three years.

"For me, it was love at first sight with quilting, because as textile artists, we can create these glorious celebrations of color and image---along a rich continuum from abstract to traditional---and then wrap up in a piece like a burrito. I also love the stories that naturally accumulate in any quilting project."

Kalia enjoys creating original designs as well as beautiful traditional patterns. She describes her quilting work as part of her spiritual practice-joyfully creative and also a form of meditation. She needs and appreciates the way this work slows her down and re-centers her in the flurry of very busy, often chaotic, modern life.
